India's President Pranab Mukherjee will meet his Jamaican counterpart on Monday as the latter is in the country on a state visit. The meeting will be the 12th visit by a head of state or government of Jamaica to India. Mukherjee and Prime Minister of Jamaica, Portia Simpson Miller, will hold the bilateral meeting here at 7.00 pm. The meeting will be held in the midst of the Caribbean country's sixth general elections and the country's first election under new Constitution. India is one of the partner countries of the Caribbean Community, which has 11 member states and common market system. Both India and Jamaica have strong cultural links and trading relations. The visit also gives a chance for the leaders to exchange views on ways to deepen India-Jamaica bilateral ties, especially in the areas of agriculture, mineral, power and energy, trade, shipping and communications. India and Jamaica maintain regular exchange of high-level visits. Earlier this year, India's External Affairs Minister, Sushma Swaraj, visited Jamaica to attend the regional summit and Union Home Minister, Rajnath Singh, visited the Caribbean country in May. Here is the itinerary of Jamaican Prime Minister Portia Simpson Miller, who will be attending the ASEAN Summit here: India and Jamaica signed a landmark memorandum of understanding (MoU) on biodiesel in July 2015. The MoU was signed by India's Minister for External Affairs, Sushma Swaraj and Jamaica's Minister of Tourism, Edmund Bartlett, at the ASEAN Foreign Ministers' Meeting (AMM) in Cambodia in July 2015. India and Jamaica signed the MoU during Dr. John Young's visit as Jamaica's Prime Minister in New Delhi in July 2015. India and Jamaica signed a bilateral trade agreement in November 2014. India has been helping Jamaica develop its agriculture sector, especially in the areas of seed production, biotechnology and molecular breeding. The two countries are working together to develop a comprehensive strategic partnership. The Indian intelligence agency Research and Analysis Wing (RAW) has lodged a complaint with the Pakistani Foreign Office regarding the release of Indian embassy's surveillance footage showing a recent attack on its consular offices in Islamabad. Amid reports that an Indian consular official was killed in the attack, Pakistan's Foreign Minister Shah Mahmood Qureshi on Friday stated that an FIR has been registered against unknown elements in connection with the killing of the diplomat
